
What is the Enthronement Way of Life?

EUCCHARIST

Attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, and receive Communion.

Observe the Ten Commandments.

Make frequent Holy Hours, especially in Adoration.

PRAYER

Gather as a family in front of the throne you have created for your Image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Pray morning and evening prayers, read Sacred Scripture, pray the Rosary, speak from your heart to His Most Sacred Heart.

Recognize the Living Presence of Jesus in your home.

As your family's Sovereign King, ask Jesus to preside over all family events, both joyous and sorrowful. Seek his direction in family disputes and problems.



PENANCE

Frequently receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a family. Demonstrate for your children that you are open to forgiving and to forgiveness.

Be faithful in your daily responsibilities and offer sacrifices and penances in reparation to the Sacred Heart.

Offer all your pains, joys, and sorrows to Jesus so he can use them to redeem others by uniting it to his own suffering and death on the cross.

You will be drawn more deeply into a divine relationship with Jesus and share in the mystery of the Trinity.

What is an Enthronement?



“Today I must stay in your house.” Luke 19:5

Why is it called an Enthronement Ceremony?

You create a “throne” for an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a prominent location in your home.

You give the Sacred Heart of Jesus sovereign authority as king and head of your family.

You “de-throne” Satan and his worldly influence in your family, and that witness then impacts your social groups and community.

How do you prepare for an Enthronement?

Create a “throne” in a prominent location in your home on which you will place an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and an “altar” on which you will place sacramentals (such as candles, flowers, rosary beads, etc.)

Choose a date and a time with your priest and promoter and invite family and friends.

Do 3 days or 9 days of special prayers together as a family.

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Wants to lovingly preside over your family, the Domestic Church, as your king and friend.

Wants desperately to ignite the hearts of you and your family so you can kindle fires in the hearts of others.

Wants to show his generous love for you by showering you with abundant graces.

What happens in an Enthronement Ceremony?

The head of the family carries an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and puts him on a “throne” (a hook or shelf) in a prominent location in your home.

Family and friends process behind the image carrying sacramentals to be placed nearby.

Together as a family, you recite the *Apostle’s Creed* and *An Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart*.

You remember the absent members of the family and those who have died by praying an *Our Father* and a *Hail Mary*.

All present together pray *The Prayer of Thanksgiving*.

Everyone present prays the *Hail Holy Queen* in an expression of love for the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Mother of God and Queen of the Home.

Family members, the promoter, and the priest or deacon sign The Enthronement Covenant which is displayed near the image.
